A. Measure R – Local Return - Carol Inge, Chief Planning Officer &
Renee Berlin, Executive Officer

The Measure R Local Return Program provides Los Angeles County jurisdictions with 15% of the net proceeds on a per capita basis for various transportation projects and programs. This item will focus on encouraging cities to work together wherever possible to promote project coordination and efficiency. Bikeway, transit or street repair projects just to name a few are some examples of projects that can be multi-jurisdictional and by cities working together, they can reap long-term benefits in reduced costs.

B. Harbor Subdivision Corridor Update (Alternatives Analysis)

The proposed Metro budget does not currently include continuing any further work on the Harbor Subdivision Rail Corridor after the alternatives analysis is complete in November.

REQUESTED ACTION: Recommend to the Board that a letter be sent to Metro objecting to work stopping on the Harbor Subdivision upon the completion of the Alternatives Analysis in November and requesting that funds be included in the budget to continue into the environmental analysis
