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South Bay Cities Council of Governments Homeless Outreach Program Supervisorial District 2 Success Story: Norma

Norma is a 77-year-old African American woman who was living in rough conditions in Detroit, Michigan until the property manager sold the building she lived in, which forced her to find a new place to live. Norma decided to move to California and quickly after arriving, she realized the high cost of living. PATH staff received a referral from a concerned community member to provide homeless assistance, and located and engaged Norma in West Carson.

PATH staff provided Norma with case management services, which included obtaining and submitting necessary documents to get an ID and Social Security card, completing senior living applications, and assistance locating housing. She was linked to PATH's Rapid Rehousing Program, and received security deposit, two month's rent, and move in and furniture assistance.

Norma has been extremely grateful for all of the assistance she has received from the SBCCOG Program, and looks forward to a better start in Los Angeles. Norma has expressed hope and comfort again resting in her own home.

PATH staff continues to do home visits with Norma, and are working to connect her to community resources and supports.



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South Bay Cities Council of Governments Homeless Outreach Program **Supervisorial District 4 Success Story: Ruben**

Ruben is a 59-year-old Hispanic male who worked most of his life as a General Laborer, and most recently for 10 years at a warehouse. Ruben was making great progress in his employment and looking forward to a promotion to a Team Lead position; however, he injured his back while working. Despite his eagerness to continue working, he was unable to and he exhausted his worker's compensation and ultimately lost his job, lost his home, and everything he had.

PATH encountered Ruben in the streets of Torrance and learned of his hardships and need for services. Ruben had been utilizing county facilities to treat his back, and so PATH completed and submitted a Housing for Health referral application and began working on increasing his income. Through PATH's advocacy, Ruben was approved for Housing for Health and found permanent housing. Today, Ruben is no longer homeless, and is doing very well in housing.

PATH has since helped Ruben complete an SSI application which is pending and despite his income being still relatively low, Ruben has expressed his gratitude about having a bed and place to rest without having to keep one eye open like he had to do on the street. Ruben is now able to schedule and attend all of his doctor appointments with a clear mind.

PATH staff is still actively working with Ruben in regards to his Social Security benefits and is helping Ruben with budgeting and adjusting to living inside.



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
