SUBJECT: Opportunity to Represent SBCCOG on Metro Transportation Advisory
Committee and Streets and Highways Sub-Committee

The South Bay Cities Council of Governments is helping recruit new representatives from the South Bay subregion to serve on Metro's Transportation Advisory Committee (TAC) and the TAC Streets and Freeways Sub-Committee. The South Bay is entitled to have one member and one alternate on each committee. Appointments are made by the League of California Cities, L. A. County Division. Our current representatives from Torrance and Redondo Beach have served for over two years and it is time to rotate the positions.

The Metro TAC is required by a 1977 state law. It's 35 members provide technical assistance to Metro staff and board members by reviewing and evaluating the various transportation project and policy proposals and alternatives within Los Angeles County including: funding, operation, construction and maintenance of streets and freeways projects, bus and rail transit programs, demand and system management, accessibility for the disabled and air quality and sustainability improvements.

TAC meets on the first Wednesday of every month at 9:30 a.m. at Metro Headquarters Building, One Gateway Plaza, Los Angeles, CA 90012-2952. More information on TAC's structure and agendas is available at: <https://www.metro.net/about/tac/> .

The 16 members of the Metro Streets and Freeways Sub-Committee of TAC provide assistance to Metro by reviewing and evaluating various transportation policies, issues and transportation funding programs in Los Angeles County as they pertain to: Call for Projects; Local, State and Federal Legislation; Funding as it relates to freeways, arterials, signals, bicycle and pedestrian projects; Project Delivery; Goods Movement; and such matters as referred to it by Metro and TAC.

Representatives on this sub-committee typically have a background in traffic or civil engineering. The Streets and Freeways Sub-committee typically meets on the third Thursday of every month at 9:30 at Metro Headquarters Building, One Gateway Plaza, Los Angeles, CA 90012-2952.
