

# 2018-2019 Transportation Highlights

#### **Measure R**

South Bay Highway Program

 13 new project applications were received and submitted to Metro as part of the annual Measure R Metro Budget Request, totaling over \$55M in new Measure R funding.

#### Measure M

Multi-Year Sub-Regional Programs

- Initial 5-year program of projects was developed.
- 32 projects applications were submitted to Metro, requesting over \$125M in Measure M funding through FY24.

SBCCOG will continue to work with cities, Caltrans, and Metro to identify additional Measure R and M projects to improve mobility in the South Bay.
