



Goal A: Environment, Transportation, & Economic


Development - Facilitate, implement and/or educate members & others about environmental, transportation, & economic development programs that benefit the South Bay.



2019-2020 Transportation Highlights

Measure R South Bay Highway Program & Measure M Multi-Year Sub-Regional Programs

- Advocated for Metro approval to use Measure R funds for highway and transit projects
- Approved use of all Measure M Sub-Regional Equity Program funds for the Centinela Grade Separation Project on the Crenshaw/LAX Line
- Established a new graduated matching-fund policy for Measure R and Measure M projects
- Completed a South Bay Call for Projects that selected new highway and transit projects to be funded from Measure R and Measure M funds



- Coordination/Collaboration bring city staff together with virtual tools
 - City Managers, Planning Directors, Local Businesses, Utility Partners
- ✓ Identifying needs and implementing solutions to those needs
 - Delivering program and meeting contract goals in new virtual platforms
